

A MESSAGE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR MR. GAGIK TARASYAN



My affiliation with "Armenian Caritas" goes back to 1995, since its very inception when my country was shuttered by the earthquake, newly gained independence and blockade, being bent under the weight of problems. "Armenian Caritas" stepped into the country and my native city in particular just in time to meet the pressing needs of the most vulnerable". Despite the difficulties, I have been relishing the challenges of working in the charitable organization, being part of the Armenian Catholic Church, to organize and implement social actions for providing relief from one side, and boosting the development of the country, from the other.

During 2015-2016 we had various commitments and numerous achievements in increasing our role in consolidation of social justice and social protection in the Republic of Armenia. I hope this Bi-Annual Review reflects this sense of purpose.

We have readopted a logo which reflects our place in the global and European Caritas family and at the same time reflects our Armenian identity. These are important signs of what we are striving to achieve: to put Caritas at the heart of what it is to be a charity. I believe this Bi-Annual Review demonstrates how we make this commitment real and effective. I also want to use this chance and express my gratitude to all those sister organizations and private benefactors who contributed to the fulfilment of our mission and vision.



INCEPTION

It sees itself as the expression as well as an instrument of charity within the Christian community. Accordingly, "Armenian Caritas" seeks to organize and implement humanitarian and charitable actions in favor of individuals and social groups living under difficult conditions with out religious, national or racial discriminations. Moreover, "Armenian Caritas" views itself as an important force in actively promoting dem ocratic and developmental changes in Armenia.

Groundwork activities began when, in 1992-93 Fr. Nerses Archb. Der-Nersessian, the Ordinary of the Armenian Catholics in Armenia, Georgia and Eastern Europe based in Gyumri, began to undertake pastoral activities in Northern Armenia. The activities were mainly targeting the northern provinces of Armenia, tremendously affected by the earthquake, and later by the economic crisis within Armenia. Also, this province is unanimously considered one of the most disadvantaged in the country due to the severity of harsh weather conditions. On October 6, 1994, Mrs. Nadjarian and Mr. Robert Quinlan from CRS Geneva visited the Armenian Catholic Ordinariate in Gyumri to assess the willingness of the Armenian Catholic Church to establish a Caritas and become engaged in relief and development activities, accept inhouse technical assistance from CRS, use future resources to promote well-being of the poor and victimized in such a way that need, not creed, become the sole determinant for extending assistance. Based on the report of Mrs. Nadjarian and Mr. Quinlan, on March 1995, a special meeting in Cyprus organized by CRS, endorsed the establishment of "Armenian Caritas." Thus, a Caritas office came to life in Armenia. In May 1995, the Armenian Catholic Church founded a Caritas office in Gyumri, the center of Shirak province. The Pastoral Board appealed to Caritas Internationalis (CI) asking o approvve the initiae and as "Armenian Caritas" was accepted into the worldwide family of Caritas as an associated member, all the necessary documents were sent to the Ministry of Justiceof the Republic of Armenia for the registraation of "Armenian Caritas" as an Armenian NGO.

Cl gave guarantees of every kind in support for the future of "Armenian Caritas." The results were soon available, as Cl, through CRS Geneva, developed a program of preparing two persons in social work. Gagik Tarasyan and Samvel Gevorgyan were invited to take part in a 40-day training seminar in Beirut and Cairo where they were acquainted with the practial work of Caritas Lebanon, Caritas Egypt, Pontif al Mission and Jinishian Memorial Fund. This was the first aaempt of capacity building for the AC sta ffmembers in order to conduct needs assess-ment, design project proposals, implement and monitor specific projects.

Upon their return, the Armenian Catholic Church provided premises for the office which was entiely renovated and completely equipped. Competent and enthusiasstiindividuals were recruited by June 1996, thanks to the financial assistance of German, Italian, English and French Caritases.

Thus, the three-member team headed by Fr. Michael Rev. Mouradian as the Executi e Director started the activitie serving the most vulnerable groups of Shirak province. Finally, in 1997, the organizationwas officially recognized by the RA Ministry of JusJustas a local NGO, and became a full member of Caritas Internationalisin June 1999.

FIRST STEPS

The first steps "Armenian Caritas" took were merely of a relief nature: the first programs "Armenian Caritas" became involved in were exclusively assistance projects. In December 1995, "Armenian Caritas" sta ffimplemented their first project - Emergency Relief Program "Merry Christmas." The beneficiaries of the project were those who, due to their lack of finances, were forced to pledge their passports in bakeries in order to purchase bread. Soon afer, "Armenian Caritas" also provided heatingfuel to four village schools in the region of Ashotsk in the Northern Armenia. For two months they made needs assessment visits to the various regions of the northern province of Armenia, held meetingswith the ccommunities to identiy and analyze the problems of the people and prepared several relief project proposals. To assess the situation and make local contacts, the Armenia Liaison Officer Mrs. Zevart Najarian visited Armenia. She met with representatives from the Ordinaries of Armenian Catholic Church in Armenia, as well as representaties from Internatonal NGOs operrang in Armenia. In 1996, a Board of Directors consisting of a President and six other members was established, with the task to design the politi al strategy of the organizationand supervise its implementaationThe number of staff gradually grew, and a finance manager and an administraate assistant joined the team, but still the burden was great... Capacity building and development projects. Due to the increase in workload, the number of staff also increased. In 1998 with the beginning of the "AC insttuuonal Capacity Building" project, funded by organiziz ons making up part of the Caritas Internationalisnetwork, the number of sta ffreached 16.

This two-year program (1998-1999) permited Caritas to set up a new office, covered all administrarae and management costs, offered support and training opportunities to the staff. The "Insnstitutional Capacity Building" program enabled AC to strengthen, be beter equipped to respond to the needs of the local population of be more prepared to face future challenges. Catholic Relief Services (CRS) as the lead agency for AC, together with CORDAID assisted the organizationin its growth and development. Over the course of time, "Armenian Caritas" subsequently extended its humanitarian and development activitie to other areas of the country, involving Lori, Gegharkunik, Ararat and Yerevan provinces. During 2015-2016 "Armenian Caritas" implemented 50 various projects in 6 strategic directions with about 150 sta ffand 80 volunteers. Along with provision of basic needs, care and development activitie for the targeted groups, "Armenian Caritas," also concentrates its efforts on the advocacy actions and state social policy revisions striving to assure more sustainable change. The organizationalso advocates for inclusive educaton as well as integraaon of an alternanve community based social service model, as successfully implemented by "Armenian Caritas." Today, Armenian Caritas boasts a solid institutiona base, with a clearly defined mission and strategy. More importantly, it maintains a strong potential for growth in order to serve its beneficiaries at an increasing capacity. "Caritas Armenia" is a member of the Caritas Internationalis confederaatio and Caritas Europe, and internationalCaritas network of over 160 members that provides emergency aid and support to countries all around the world.

SOCIAL PROTECTION



THE OLDER PEOPLE

The older people (12,9% of the entie populaationare e particularly affected by the economic and social problems of current trransition period in Armenia. They receive miserable pension that is their only income provided by state. High-cost health services, few psychological centers, lack of appropriate daily care make the elderly live on without any income hardly making both ends meet. Due to growing number of elderly people and a high trend of youth migrationthe country is considered to be aging. The aging populationmeets a lot of hardships for they are not enough supported by the Armenian Government and its structures in spite of the fact that they own long term work experience leftbehind without any opportunity that could allow them to live on independently. "Armenian Caritas" is well positioned in the area of elderly care and protections ince not many non-governmental organizaation deal with elderly issues. Thus, "AC" combines home and institution acare model to the elderly people. AC has adapted up-to-date progressive home care methodology.

"Armenian Caritas" was the first in Armenia to iniiate the establishment of the Armenian Network of state and civil organizatons dealing with Elderly Issues bringing into one local platorm, internaationaand private sector organizazations.

Promote the well-being of the elderly population while increasing the social responsibility of local authorities and society through raising awareness of the hardships endured by the elderly during winter in the Shirak, Lori, and Gegharkunik Provinces of Armenia.

ACTIVITIES:

The "Warm Winter" project covers the cost of heating for beneficiaries during three months of winter. Beneficiaries of this project primarily include disabled and disadvantaged people, including elderly citizens involved in the "Armenian Caritas" "Home Care" projects in Gyumri, Vanadzor, and Gavar; and elderly citizens involved in the Day Care Centers in Gyumri and Tashir. "Armenian Caritas" has developed a system according to which the staff respond to the needs of our beneficiaries a timely, efficient, and fair manner. We first conducted a survey to discover, how the project beneficiaries heat their living spaces. The project encourages fundraising among local government authorities to increase levels of participation and involvement in the provision of social support. In 2012, a symbolic amount of 1,000 Armenian dram per beneficiary was raised from local authorities, in addition to the standard amount allocated by Caritas for heating expenses.

The Warm Winters project also strives to raise awareness among the community and local authorities about issues affecting the elderly in order to strengthen the engagement of the state and civil society



Promote improvement of the life quality for the older people living in the cities of Gyumri, Vanadzor, Gavar, Artashat through provision of Home Care and Home Nursing services.

ACTIVITIES:

Issues affecting the older population have always been a focus of "Armenian Caritas" activities. In 2002-2009 with only 50 beneficiaries, our "Home Care" project now currently serves 360 older people; additionally, the project has increased its geographical reach to include the cities of Gavar and Vanadzor and including also Artashat city from October, 2016. Through the National "Home Care" program, these 360 elderly people in need of care receive regular nursing care, and are provided with medical services, information, and consultancies about care and health prophylactics. Program beneficiaries are also provided with necessary items for their rehabilitation and support, including hand sticks, walkers, neck supporters, and other materials. In addition to the health and medical support, the program assists the older people with gathering documentation for the protection and exercise of their civil rights (i.e. pension, obtaining welfare, applying for new housing, hooking up electricity or gas supply, assisting in juridical conflict resolution, etc.). The working group also lobbies and advocates for better social, health, and living conditions for the older people.



Contribute 50 disabled elderly citiens of Gyumri (located in Shirak province, Armenia) and 60 in Tashir to integrate into society and receive equal treatment through the provision of a range of supporte services, including legal and social assistance.

BACKGROUND:

This project has variety of directions that include entertainment activities Daily leisure e activit include table games, intereseresTV programs, concerts with professional musicians and schoolchildren, and visits museums and the theatre.

It also include humanitarian resources such as food commodities (they are feed twice a day), hygienic items, specific medicaations needed by the elderly, and the provision of clothing.

All beneficiaries are registered with the State polyclinics, where they receive medical assistance. Medical nurse provide health care service. Beneficiaries are provided with medicine.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The elderly living alone in Armenia (especially with disabilities) face considerable social-economic and health difficulties in their everyday life. They are isolated from the social activities and there are no institutions that could organize specific activities for them, making their day more interesting and productive. But the most vital problem for them is obtaining daily food. Provision of some food on a monthly basis will give 200 beneficiaries a chance to preserve their nutrition needs by getting the minimum dry food. The program will foster to raise sense of dignity and life activeness among the beneficiaries, to preserve their health and nutrition conditions.

OBJECIVE:

To promote the nutrition conditions, as well as to promote the life style, and well-being of 200 elderly people in the city of Gyumri, Shirak Province, R.A.

GOAL:

Improve the life quality of 200 elderly people in Gyumri city through provision of dry food.



CHILD PROTECTION

The Government continuously lacks resources to give final solutions to problems in the sector and relies a lot on international organizations to cover the gap in providing alternative care to children, including children with disabilities living in critical conditions.

The RA legislation associated with protecting the child from an insult, absence of care, indifference or rude treatment is not clear. One of the challenges in child rights protection in Armenia was and in some terms remains the economic situation and poverty. The social inclusion processes in Armenia proceed at a slower pace than anticipated. "AC" is ready to enter into dialogue with the Government on its participation in the process on closer basis and to contribute to acceleration of social integration. AC implements familyoriented support for children and adolescents in critical circumstances in four "Little Prince" Day Care Social Centers since 2009. In October 2016 another center opened up in the city of Artashat. Through these centers AC strives to integrate disadvantaged children and youth socially through providing social and psychological work, promotion of healthy lifestyle and educational and life-skills trainings. These centers are important institutions that can be sustainably operated to continue such support and AC strives to bring Government attention to their sustainability.

BACKGROUND:

People with disabilities are separated and isolated from the rest of the society because they are seen as an embarrassment or weakness for the entire family. In many cases, one family member is given for the responsibility of caring for the disable individual. According to "Armenian Caritas" research, people with multiple disabilities, especially children, are deprived of normal living conditions. They do not get social services either from state structures or from other organizations and they are doomed to remain secluded in their homes. Goal: To integrate children with multiple disabilities and their families into the society by providing supportive services.

GOAL:

To integrate children with multiple disabilities and their families into the society by providing supportive services.

OBJECTIVIES:

To improve the life quality of 50 children with multiple disabilities and their families in Gyumri city, give children with multiple disabilities the opportunity to gain basic operational skills, which they can use in their daily lives by providing them with social and developmental services.

Provision of hygiene and medical care Provision of nourishment Psychological rehabilitation and life skills development Organizing educational activities Social and psychological consultations.



Strengthening the capacities of non- state actors and relevant authorities in Armenia and Belarus to be able to implement the 2012 UNICEF recommendations on children with disabilities, to advocate the rights of persons/children with disabilities and to improve services for them as well as their participation.

BACKGROUND:

Vocational classes for disabled and socially vulnerable children in three schools (school #65 in Yerevan, school #1 in Chambarak and school #7 in Gyumri city)- In 2015 a number of 42 children participated in vocational classes.

Children received support for secondary, higher and advanced vocational education. In 2015 a number of 8 students received support for higher education, 1 student for studying at the college. In 2016, 1 student received support for her study at the college. Total, in two years 10 students received support).

Children and parents who received vocational trainings: In 2015 a number of 6 children in Gegharkounik province received vocational skills and 1 child from Yerevan attended classes of painting.

TRAININGS ON ART THERAPY:

17 members of multidisciplinary teams of inclusive schools participated in these seminars.

Seminars on experience and information exchange were held among school staffs and multidisciplinary team members of inclusive schools in three provinces. 96 teachers and members of multidisciplinary teams participated in these seminars.

These are mainly the families that have low budgets, low parenting abilities, drug or alcohol addiction. 1. Socio-psychological complex assistance to 115 children and youth aged 10-15 and their family members.

2. Life skill development opportunities for children and professional development of their parents/family members.



DESCRIPTION:

The project strives to integrate disadvantaged children and youth socially through providing social and psychological work, promotion of healthy lifestyle and educational and life-skills trainings. Other objectives of the project are provision of their families with proper knowledge and skills for improving their social conditions and work with communities and schools for better understanding the children needs and gaining their support for integration of children. Primary direct target group of the project are 12-18 years old 120 children and youth (85 in Gyumri, and 35 in Tashir) from disadvantaged families and members of their families. These are mainly the families that have low budgets, low parenting abilities, drug or alcohol addiction.

Secondary direct targets are Gyumri and Tashir communities and 12 community secondary schools: 9 schools in Gyumri and 3 in Tashir.

Among the objectives of the program is the active work with schools and communities for supporting children's needs and identifying their effective integration.

BACKGROUND:

Education is the foundation for a healthy and developed society, as well as a vital determinant of civic culture and participation in democratic politics. The sphere of education in Armenia is emphasized by the government of Armenia as one of prerequisites for sustainable development of the country, preservation of human capital and its reproduction.

The highest overall child poverty rate is observed in Shirak province in 2014, where more than 50% of children are poor. For children poverty means risks for malnutrition, overall development and deprivation of basic conditions for child well-being. Therefore, tackling child can not wait until fiscal circumstances are seen as accommodating. Reorienting social protection expenditure towards more efficient models may mitigate devastating effects of poverty on children and break the intergenerational cycle of poverty that threatens human development and economic growth.

"Armenian Caritas" has always made endeavors to solve the issues of the communities that uses its accepted strategic directions. Byurakn, Arevik and Hovuni villages of Shirak province are the communities that need betterment in the field of social and educational sectors. The population of these communities is approximately 2000 persons who are mainly engaged in cattle-breeding and agriculture.

GOAL:

Improvement of the Educational conditions of the 3 targeted schools in Byurakn, Arevik and Hovuni village schools and in Arevik Kindergarten.

OBJECTIVIES:

 Rehabilitate Byurakn village school drinking water supply by constructing well and connecting to school existing network
Change Arevik village old damaged windows with new metalplastic ones.

- 3. Renovation of the school buffet
- 4. Renovation of Arevik village kindergarten

ACTIVITIES:

This program has to be considered as a development of the work carried out by "AC" during the past 20 years with the village schools hosting vulnerable and needy children. The implementation of the project will be carried out by "AC" staff members in collaboration with representatives from the targeted schools.

During the summer, "AC" will concentrate its activities on organizing community efforts to renovate the school buildings in 3 village schools and in one kindergarten.

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
WARM WINTER FOR CHILDREN

To contribute to the improvement of heating conditions and prevention of cold-driven diseases of socially vulnerable families in Gyumri, Vanadzor, Tashir and Gavar (519 children in 178 families).

BACKGROUND:

Most children in Gyumri, Vanadzor, Gavar and Tashir live in such extreme poverty that even obtaining daily food and access to health care is a challenge for them. Their life is at or below the subsistence level are the main causes of impaired health. To improve the living conditions of 519 children, constituting the most vulnerable 178 families in Gyumri, Vanadzor, Tashir and Gavar "Armenian Caritas" provides heating means for the children.

IMPROVEMENT OF SOCIAL CONDITIONS OF SINGLE MOTHERS IN GYUMRI

BACKGROUND:

Most single mothers in Gyumri live in a situation of extreme poverty and even daily food and access to health care is a major problem for them. Poverty and the life at or below the subsistence level are the main causes of poor health. The consequences of poverty are a greater personal health risk for single mothers for they have poor nutrition, little chance of accessing knowledge, and limited possibilities for health care. Accordingly, poor health in turn results in greater poverty.

Single mothers living alone are deprived of the normal life conditions and their only income is the miserable pension and more miserable welfare (if any). They do not get social services either from state structures or from other organizations. They have serious health problems, many of them have disabilities or are weak for breeding animals or do home activities, or agricultural works of their own to be self-sustainable. Besides, they are doomed to stay all day at home having nowhere to go for leisure. They consider themselves useless for the society and their families and they feel psychologically depressed. It is obvious that single mothers in many respects are particularly affected by the enormous economic and social problems. "Armenian Caritas" based on its great expertise in implementing social projects aims to improve the living conditions of the most vulner-able single mothers in Gyumri, by provision of medications, firewood, food commodities, hygienic items and stationery for their children.

GOAL:

Improvement of the social conditions of 10 single mothers in Gyumri (50 beneficiaries).

OBJECTIVES:

To assist single10 mothers (and their 40 children) in providing food commodities, hygienic items, stationery, text books, blankets/linen/ towels, firewood, diesel fuel for heating purposes, medicine, etc.

BACKGROUND:

A needs assessment is a systematic process for determining and addressing needs, or "gaps" between current conditions and desired conditions or "wants". The discrepancy between the current condition and wanted condition must be measured to appropriately identify the need. The need can be a desire to improve current performance or to correct a deficiency. A needs assessment is a part of planning processes, often used for improvement in individuals, education/ training, organizations, or communities.

It can be an effective tool to clarify problems and identify appropriate interventions or solutions.

By clearly identifying the problem, finite resources can be directed towards developing and implementing a feasible and applicable solution.

Gathering appropriate and sufficient data informs the process of developing an effective product that will address the groups' needs and wants.

There are three perspectives on need in a needs assessment; perceived need, expressed need and relative need. Within a performance improvement framework, needs assessments play a critical role in starting the improvement process.

GOAL:

Development of Community Needs Assessment in 4 provinces of Armenia.

OBJECTIVE:

The overall objective of the project was the development of Community Needs Assessment (CNA) document in 10 rural communities. Taking into consideration the currency rate growth, instead of 10 communities we implemented the CNA in 13 communities of four provinces. The needs assessment provided the basis for strategic interventions, ascertaining household and community specific demographics in order to develop context specific, sustainable long-term programs or projects that are relevant and driven by the needs of the communities. This can serve as a baseline and continual operational research, which will enable effective measurement of any change or long-term impact during and post programming interventions.





SHIRAK PROVINCE

BACKGROUND:

The economic and social background of people living in villages, high level of unemployment, increased migration to the countries with high indicators of HIV as well as insufficient awareness level of transmission and prevention of the infection make the spreading of HIV in the province easier. The estimation of HIV registered cases of the RA is the highest in Shirak Province, i.e. 114.0 per population of 100,000.

GOAL:

To promote safe behavior among community members including high school children as well as primarily migrants and their families, through implementation of awareness raising and preventive activities. The project collaborates with the local priest/religious leader of each target community. Sixty communities are included in the project.

OBJECTIVES:

To contribute to the prevention of HIV/AIDS infections through increased awareness and information and improved access to diagnosis and consultation in post-soviet countries.

PROJECT ACTIVITIES:

Capacity building of the project team including community coordinators and religious leaders through training courses, seminars, discussions and exchange activities.



REHABILITATION OF WATER SUPPLY SYSTEMS IN SEVERAL SETTLEMENTS (SHIRAK PROVINCE)

FUNDING PARTNERS:





BACKGROUND:

Armenia has abundant water resources that are generally adequate for drinking, irrigation, and industrial use throughout the country, with some limitations in a few areas. Water usage has been reduced after independence due to a reduction of industrial and agricultural activities. The systems were constructed using cast iron and steel components and are now well past their normal life. Corrosion of pipelines result in water losses of up to 90% in some cases. This in turn can compromise the quality of the water within the distribution system. Water losses or nonrevenue water is estimated at 85%, which according to the World Bank is one of the highest percentages of water losses in the world. More than 50% of water losses are due to leaks from old pipes, and the remainder is due to nonpayment, underpayment, or theft.

GOAL:

"AC" has initiated the present program with the aim of improving the social, sanitary/hygienic and household conditions of the population living in several rural settlements of Shirak Province through the provision of a sanitary, secure, reliable and sustainable water supply. "AC" will also work to build the local capacity for managing their water supply and systems. Sustainable water infrastructure is a necessary precondition for the preservation of the communities and their long-term development.

OBJECTIVIES:

To provide a long-term, safe and reliable drinking water supply in Tsoghamarg, Krashen and Anushavan villages.

ACTIVITIES:

The following activities were implemented during the reporting period. The community representatives were informed that "Renovabis" had approved the project proposal prepared by "AC".

Then, meeting days were fixed in the communities to create a climate of mutual respect, understanding and trust and to develop in the partners the sense of "community as a social construct". As soon as these activities were completed the project staff, in a short period, in accordance with the top managers announced a tender among the local licensed construction companies for execution of works in project sites. As a result one company was selected. According to the signed agreement the first transfer equal to 70 % of the estimation was made in order the contractors could purchase the necessary construction materials



GOAL:

The goal of the project is to improve social conditions in 5 villages in Northern Armenia by encouraging Catholic Social Teaching inspired behavior change in parish leaders in order to increase their capacity to promote Christian inspired volunteerism and to mobilize volunteers in their community to support self-determination and community development.

DESCRIPTION:

Seeking to help communities address their development needs, CRS/ South Caucasus developed a regional Parish Social Ministry (PSM) project that adapted conventional PSM approaches to the individual needs of Armenian Caritas, Caritas Georgia and the Roman Catholic Community of Baku. The project began in 2006. As a result of this project "Armenian Caritas" experienced excellent success at developing PSM groups in six villages. They developed a unique, integrated and locally adapted PSM training module, devised to provide facilitators with the necessary knowledge and skills to promote PSM within their communities. Paired with a small grants component, the participants and the local communities were able to witness the practical and tangible results of PSM/CST principles. Five of the six original groups thrive today, over two years later. Their ability to support self-determination is evidenced by their continued work in community improvement activities, carrying out their own fund-raising and volunteer recruitment activities. "Armenian Caritas" wanted to expand the PSM concept to another 5 villages (Katnarat, Katnaghbyur, Petrovka, Saratovka, Blagodarnoye).

The project promotes creation of PSM committees, who work on volunteer basis to research, formulate the problems and implement projects that may solve the most urgent needs. The overall approach is more of sustainable nature as there is minimum involvement of "Armenian Caritas" staff and the Parish priest in the core implementation. We serve as an inspiring, guiding and capacity building



BACKGROUND:

During the implementation of the different projects "Armenian Caritas" discovered the need of vocational trainings to insure somehow the economic stability of poor and marginalize families. During the years of 2007-2016 over 120 women have attended the short-term and long-term trainings at the workshop and due to the application of acquired knowledge and skills are now able to somehow contributed to the improvement of the living conditions of their families.

GOAL:

Since July 2014 started the third three-year phase of the "Handicraft Workshop" project with a goal of providing women with opportunity for gaining economic independence thus decreasing chances of violence against women.

OBJECTIVES:

To train 50 women as sewing specialists and to provide them with additional handicraft skills using peer education, methodological consultancy and through organizing social events; and to provide women with small business running skills to insure their employability and economic independence.

ACTIVITIES:

Throughout the three years (2014-2017) of the project the beneficiaries will be divided into five groups and each group will undergo 12 months-long sewing training parallel to which short-term trainings in knitting, batik and beading will be provided.

To insure even better quality and more compatible production, we have also started to involve a designer for the practical phase of the training, who will assist us in producing lines of clothing with contemporary design, that have more demand in the market.

BACKGROUND:

Hovuni village is 13 km north-west from the provincial center Gyumri. The village is situated on the right bank of Akhuryan river. 1750m above sea level. The climate is mountainous, with cold and long winters (six months). The ancestors of Hovuni inhabitants emigrated from Basen village in Western Armenia. In Soviet times the population of the village was 1000, now it is 605. The main occupation of the villagers is cattle breeding and farming. Seasonal migration is the main source of income source of income for the male population of the village. Women are doing all agricultural activities from April till October.

GOAL:

School is an educational center, where pupils gain much knowledge, skills; it's the center, where the creators of our bright future are educated and grown. In order to organize the education correctly, the corresponding educational environment, comfortable conditions and a nice atmosphere should be provided in these educational institutions. The provision of safe water and sanitation facilities in schools is a first step towards a healthy physical learning environment benefiting both learning and health. However, the mere provision of facilities does not make them sustainable or produce the desired impact. It is the use of technical facilities and the related appropriate hygiene behaviors of people that provide health benefits.

In schools, hygiene education aims to promote those practices that will help prevent water and sanitation-related diseases as well as promoting healthy behavior in the future generation of adults.

Improvement of educational conditions of Hovuni village school

Renovate two lavatories of the school;



Organize training sessions and campaigns for Shirak, Lori and Gegharkunik provinces' community residents and pupils or students on migration and human trafficking.

Integrate the topic of "migration" into school curriculum.

Cooperate with stakeholders in state and non-governmental sector to raise awareness on the topics.

ACTIVITIES:

Training sessions for 48 teachers in three provinces of the RA based on the developed material.

Awareness- raising campaigns in target provincs through mobile resource centers operated by State Employment Agency.





"SURPRISING EUROPE"

BACKGROUND:

Surprising Europe is a project started by Witfilm (a media production foundation) and is an international cross-media information campaign concerning to the life of (working) migrants in Europe and in which Armenia got engaged from March 2015 to June 2015. As a lot of research done by the European Union indicates that migrants poorly inform themselves about their future destination thus having exaggerated expectations.

GOAL:

The project aims to raise awareness on different dimensions of migration and the real life expecting them in Europe as well as to encourage potential migrants to prepare their departure well or reconsider their decision through exchange of information and experience.

OBJECTIVES:

1. To shoot a documentary film with the involvement of Armenian migrants.

2. To raise awareness among potential migrants in Lori, Shirak and Gegharkunik provinces and in Yerevan.

3. To organize thematic competitions and exhibitions to shed light on the topic of migration through art.

ACTIVITIES:

Within the framework of the project, two documentary films with the involvement of two returnee families from Belgium and the Netherlands were shot. They tell their stories after return and after becoming beneficiaries of the returnee projects implemented by "Armenian Caritas" Benevolent NGO. In Gegharkunik province, the film was screened at Vardenis Community Development Centre after which a discussion was initiated. Besides, in order to reach a wider public, a video on the project and the issues that migrants face was shot and broadcast by local "Geghama" TV. In Shirak province, the film was at two basic schools. Later, a discussion was initiated and a thematic essay or painting competition among schoolchildren was announced. In Lori province, the film was screened among schoolchildren. In Yerevan, however, the awareness raising campaign was carried out in a different format. Firstly, the film was screened at Yerevan State College of Fine Arts after Panos Terlemezvan after which a competition for thematic pieces of art was announced. Later, the thematic pieces of art were submitted to a wider public in the form of an exposition, thus shedding light on migration and trafficking related issues through art.

GOAL:

To ensure the safety of children within all child-oriented projects through elaboration and application of the "Armenian Caritas" Child Safeguarding Policy.

ACTIVITIES:

"Armenian Caritas," highlighting the need to create a safe and secure environment for children in its Centers, embarked on the development of the child safeguarding policy. Within the framework of the project an expert was selected to conduct an internal self-evaluation of the organization with the purpose of creating such policy, the results of which will serve to develop such policy and its implementation mechanisms. The project beneficiaries are "Armenian Caritas" beneficiaries (children, young people and their families), staff and volunteers. At the end of the project "Armenian Caritas" will have a clear policy and its implementation mechanisms to ensure the safeguarding of the children in all its centers.

PREVENTION OF POSSIBLE LANDSLIDES IN THE VILLAGE OF VAHAGNI

GOAL:

Goal of the project was to prevent the possible landslides in the community of Vahagni by constructing water removal system

ACTIVITIES:

The village of Vahagni had been constructed in the XIX century without taking into consideration vulnerability of the location. The landscape of the village is dominantly comprised of clayey soils which makes more prone to landslides. Besides, the village is surrounded by mountains and forests, and waters from rain or melted snow goes down the hills causing strong flow of waters and goes through the village uncontrollably. In order to control water-flow in the village and reduce landslide vulnerability water removal channels were installed. Overall 610 meters of water channel was installed – 240 meters with 500 diameter iron tubes and 370 meters with 700 diameter iron tubes (cut in two halves). The water channels were connected with the general system in the village which pours into the river Pambak. In front of the houses the channels were covered with metallic nets for easy crossing and security reasons.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AS A FIRST STEP TO SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

BACKGROUND:

Armenia and Georgia are both prone to different types of natural disasters, such as floods, earthquakes and landslides. The maybe widely known example of disasters covering the provinces of Shirak and Lori is the Spitak earthquake of 1988, which took about 25,000 person lives. Disasters happen frequently affecting large groups of the population and causing severe damages in infrastructure (transportation infrastructure, water and sewage water systems, electricity supply) and high economic losses.

GOAL:

Make rural communities in Armenia and Georgia resilient to natural disasters caused by hydro-meteorological factors, climate changes and seismic hazards and to reduce the negative impact, these disasters impose on the human and economic development of these communities.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES AND PRIORITIES:

The project will respond to the identified situation at three levels: 1. Risk assessment – to identify the principal vulnerabilities of local communities and define solutions adapted to the specific needs; 2. Concrete action in selected pilot communities in the area of disaster preparedness using a methodology and informative materials developed for this purpose;

3. Multiplication of the project results in close collaboration with civil proection authorities.

THE PROJECT REFERS TO SEVERAL PRIORITIES:

Supporting agriculture and development of a sustainable economy in the context of climate changes: the project aims to reduce the negative impact of natural disasters, including floods, landslides (both directly connected to climate change) on the economic and human development of rural communities in both countries.

Transition to democracy: the community-based approach builds on the involvement and participation of the citizens of the project community, which is a basic condition for a working democracy. Education: disaster preparedness, first of all is a question of knowledge.

For this reason, the project includes also educational activities, implemented at the village schools.


NEEDS ASSESSMENT OF DISPLACED POPULATION FROM NAGORNO-KARABAKH REPUBLIC

GOAL:


The Goal of the Project was to identify gaps in the humanitarian crises in NK by collecting information on the location and needs of vulnerable, conflict-affected households and information on assistance provided by other organizations in the field.

ACTIVITIES:

During the escalations of hostilities in April 2016, several villages and towns of Nagorno-Karabakh Republic were heavily or partially damaged. The population from the communities of Talish, Mataghis, Tonashen and Martakert fled to safer places – either within the terri-tory of Nagorno-Karabakh or to different provinces of Armenia. According to several sources, in total around 3,000-4,000 people were displaced as a result of the escalations of hostilities. With the technical support of CRS, needs assessment teams were formed by AC to collect information from the displaced population in Armenia and NK in order to respond the humanitarian crisis accordingly.

Based on the observations and recommendations of Needs Assessment Report a project proposal was elaborated and sent to CRS for approval. The project proposed cash-based assistance to the displaced households having members of children under 14, pregnant women and new mothers, people with disabilities and chronic diseases, etc.

GOAL:


Provide humanitarian assistance to population affected by the escalation of hostilities in Nagorno-Karabakh Republic.

ACTIVITIES:

On April 1-5, 2016 large-scale ceasefire violations took place along the Line of Contact in the Nagorno-Karabakh conflict zone which caused need of humanitarian support to the population being affected. To reduce the harm of emergency "Armenian Caritas" with the support of "Caritas Italiana" responded to the humanitarian needs in Nagorno-Karabakh, delivering boxes of food commodities to the humanitarian aid coordination body in Stepanakert. "Armenian Caritas" with 5 delegates onboard organized the transportation and delivery of the humanitarian aid to the coordination body. The general volume of the aid was 1.88 tones, with 200 boxes containing 13 food items, with 9.4kg /20.7 pounds/ each. The boxes were prepared and packed with the active participation of volunteers and staff. The coordination body in Stepanakert was to organize further distribution of the boxes to the affected or displaced population according to their urgent needs and place of temporary settlement.


